



Parental Consent

in conjunction with Cycling UK affiliated membership

All participants under the age of 18 (a Youth Rider) must have the consent of a parent or guardian to take part in Cycle Seahaven rides or events. By signing the Household Membership form, I hereby give consent for any of my children or wards to participate in Cycle Seahaven rides and events as detailed below.

A Youth Rider must ride with a parent or guardian, or another adult acting as loco parentis. During the ride the loco parentis must always take responsibility for the actions of the Youth Rider. It is good practice to inform the Ride Leader if a Youth Rider will be on the ride.

- I understand that everyone must wear a properly fitting cycle helmet when riding with Cycle Seahaven.
- I accept that the road worthiness of a Youth Rider's bike is my responsibility.
- I acknowledge that I am solely responsible for making the decision about the Youth Rider's ability to participate in (and complete) a ride.
- I understand the Youth Rider may cycle with adults and/or other Youth Riders, but that there is also a possibility of the Youth Rider cycling, briefly, on their own. For example, during a treasure hunt.
- I accept that Cycle Seahaven extends a welcome to cyclists of all ages and abilities, but there are no special provisions for Youth Riders.
- I acknowledge that arrangements to get the Youth Rider to and from the ride are my responsibility.
- I understand that event organisers or ride leaders may not have been subject to Disclosure Barring Service checks.
- I consent to the ride leader(s) acting in loco parentis, if the need arises to administer emergency first aid and/or other medical treatment to the Youth Rider.
- I consent to club officials transporting the Youth Rider in their cars if there is a requirement to do so. For example, if a parent is unable, due to unforeseen circumstances.
- I understand that Cycle Seahaven, its members, agents and other participants reserve the right to take and subsequently publish photographs during an event or ride for publicity purposes. If you have concerns about this, please speak to the ride leader or event organisers.
